Eric Macey Argues Before Illinois Supreme Court on Damages for “Intrusion upon Seclusion”

The *Chicago Daily Law Bulletin*, in an article published on March 16, 2012, reported on a case argued by [Eric N. Macey](#) before the Illinois Supreme Court. Mr. Macey challenged an appellate court judgment on compensatory and punitive damages in a lawsuit alleging “intrusion upon seclusion.” The plaintiff was a woman who claimed her former employer had invaded her privacy while investigating its belief she was directing business to a competitor, the *Law Bulletin* reported.

Mr. Macey, on behalf of defendant, “appealed a 1st District Appellate Court’s decision to reinstate the plaintiff’s reduced damages award, throw out damages the [defendant] received on a counterclaim and add \$600,000 in attorney fees to improve the plaintiff’s compensatory-to-punitive damages ratio,” the *Law Bulletin* wrote.
