Novack and Macey Attorneys Win Emergency Relief for Corporate Client

A corporate client of Novack and Macey LLP recently decided to seek emergency judicial relief to prohibit one of its founders from engaging in conduct that could damage its relationships with key customers. The founder had previously owned one half of the business and served as one of its officers. But he sold his interest and resigned as an officer over a year ago. He had recently announced, however, that he intended to contact several dozen of the corporation's customers — without permission and over the corporation's objections — to obtain information from those customers.

The same day that the firm's client decided to seek relief, Novack and Macey attorneys including [Stephen J. Siegel](#) prepared and filed an emergency motion, supporting memorandum and affidavit seeking a temporary restraining order. The motion was filed on behalf of another founder of the corporation and joined by the corporation itself and a related entity.

Based on the filings and the arguments presented, a Cook County judge immediately issued a detailed restraining order prohibiting the founder from going forward with his planned conduct.
